WHITE STOCKINGS VS. MUTUALS. Special Dispatch to The Tribune.

NEW YORK, June 17.—The Chicagos to-day got beautifully even with the Mutuels for the defeat of Thursday, marking up a good game by the decisive score of 10 to 3. There were about 3,000 people on the grounds, it being one of the largest audiences of the season. The Mutes lost the toss. After the first two men were out Treacy sent a hot one to Anson, and the latter not only fumbled the ball, but sent it away over McVey's head, and the runner took third, whence he was sent home by Hallinan's hit for a base. The Chicagos also took a run in this inning, on Barnes' bit, which was well backed up by White's two-baser. The same player scored again in the third inning on an error at the Mutual third base. The batting mania broke out badly in the fourth inning, when Anson took first on a clean hit, and every man from there around to Hines hit safely. The result was five runs, though only three of them were earned. In the next inning Hines was badly muffed by Craver, and, taking first in that way, was sent home by Anson's fine three-baser to the dressing-house. The Mutes took a run in the sixth inning on a wild throw by Peters, and another in the ninth on a muff by McVey.

The fine playing of the game was done by Barnes, Hines, Anson, and Glenn, for the Whites, and Hallinan, and Treacy for the Mutuels. The large number of brilliant plays made the game the most interesting of the season to look at. The resume of the trip shows 12 games played with League clubs and 10 of them won. In them the Chicagos have scored 86 runs, as against 35 for their opponents. The season being now a trifle more than one-third done, the Chicagos show a clear lead in games won, having captured 20 out of 24 played, making in the aggregate 159 runs as against 72 for all their opponents. The batting average shows Barnes in the lead, with Hines next, and White a good third. The Whites left for Chicago this evening. They will play in London, Ont., Monday, and arrive home Tuesday morning.
